Perspective and Frescos

Chemistry, problem solving, building skills and maths met art for class 7/8 and homeschooled adolescents over the past month in the *Perspective and Frescos*, Creative Skills block. But, shhhh, don't tell them! They just thought they were having fun!

The students looked at the development of perspective from the Middle Ages through the Renaissance and learnt how to mix and apply plaster- this is a fine art! They faced challenges with cracking and bumpy plaster, problem-solved through altering ratios and had to let go when some of the painting needed to be removed. Later in the year, the students will learn how Chemistry is fundamental to fresco painting when they study the lime cycle. The students drew individual designs for the fresco image and then created a new image from an amalgamation of those ideas. They then had to measure out and upscale the image using a grid. The finished fresco looks amazing and it is something they are all very proud of. Hopefully it will withstand the test of time!

Next the students are unwittingly learning about physics and engineering using mainly recycled materials as they design and fly kites! They are coming up with some very original ideas and are enjoying the windy weather! Do spread the word to any homeschooling families you know - we would love to have them join some of our future blocks!

Covid-19 Reminder

Please inform the school if you or your child has any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19). You are advised to get a test as soon as possible and stay at home until you get the result.

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal
