Looking back

AGM



This year's AGM was well-attended and covered a range of issues relating to the ongoing development, challenges and improvements to the School. For those unable to be there, the financial statements and minutes will be prepared and published on the website shortly. The financial year ending August 2018 had seen changes to the management structure and a school inspection, as well as decisions about the structure of the kindergartens, a commitment to combined classes in the Lower School and the investigation into expanding into an Upper School. The need to review staff pay and conditions was also highlighted as a priority action. All this set in motion a process of ensuring the long-term sustainability of the School but were just first steps and required time to settle in. Unfortunately, this settling in process has been radically set back under the pressure of an imminent inspection under OFSTED.

The OFSTED inspections have brought significant challenges to the whole Steiner movement in England. Our School is as vulnerable to these as the others, but it is also important to acknowledge there are advantages too, as well as requirements for change and adaptation. Whatever the outcome of this, it will positively contribute to the ongoing review of the School and its future. Issues debated at the AGM included state-funding and the possible recruitment of a headteacher/principal. But the means of survival are premised not just on robust organisation and compliance but also confidence in the distinctive education we offer – the education you have chosen for your child/ren. The Trustees are wholly committed to ensuring this. As we navigate the challenges, we call on you for your commitment also.

The inspection is due at any moment – we are one of just three Steiner schools in England left to be inspected. **Please note that when the inspection is called, parents will be requested to complete a Parent View questionnaire.** This is a statutory requirement, informing the inspectors' judgement of the School and we would appreciate your completing this within the day.

Oslo City Steiner School - Class 12 Concert at Cambridge Steiner School! *Thursday* 9th of May!

We are delighted and so very fortunate to host Oslo City Steiner School's Class Twelve concert. The concert will be held in the school's Hall in two sessions.

11:45 - 12:30 for kindergarten parents and young children

14:00 - 14:55 for lower school parents and children

Who are they...?

'In the subject lesson 'Music dissemination/ Music production' we learn how to work with music in a process of going from the greater "Me" to the greater "We". We learn how to work acoustically, in any room, with any genre, and to treat all music as chamber music, as a group and a team.

The main thing is to learn the power of "balance", and that everyone owns the responsibility, not taking focus from the soloist and "storyteller" and to learn the importance of being loyal to the group and the purpose of the song. We learn about how complex patterns and harmonies can be made easy, if everyone is doing their little part wholeheartedly.'

They'll play Norwegian folk music sung Acapella, music by Toto, Supertramp, Fernando Sor, and Mozart, Jazz, and also more contemporary pop songs both Norwegian and English.

What do other people say...

"... Like most of the Waldorf schools in Scandinavia, the Oslo Waldorf school does not take state exams, concentrating instead in the Steiner curriculum which is delivered with such effect that entry in to University and further education is achieved - with a high rate of success – by means of interview and portfolio.

Their two concerts...were extraordinary, with a range and texture of sound and musicianship that revealed a strong commitment to ensemble playing and a wide variety of musical genres. Whilst not an orchestra in the classical sense, their playing held something of the original Greek word 'orkheisthai', meaning 'to dance' – as each piece, whether jazz, classical or folk, had a lightness, harmonic delicacy and, most rarely, a wonderful attention to the power of diminuendo and the quieter ranges. Our students were spellbound in both performances – a testament perhaps to one of the Oslo player's suggestion that 'music is the closest thing to magic'.

...One Class 4 pupil told me 'It was the best concert ever' and I believe that the Oslo players' spirited but also self-effacing interpretations of a wide choice of pieces (from Rihanna to Mozart via Paganini and Fleetwood Mac) will stay with our pupils for a long time. The players' awareness of each other and their unassuming but highly skilled performances were authentic, deeply motivated and deeply moving...'
