## Whole School Messages/ Community Updates

### Communication / School Development Update from SCT

Improving communication has been highlighted as a key area for development within the school. We greatly value the commitment and input of you, our parent body, and we plan to host a parent's evening next term that will focus on the school's plans for improvement and developments for the future. ### **Fine Woodwork Club**

This term, on Wednesdays, we are running a fine woodworking after school club for children age 7 up. The sessions will start on Wednesday 15th May, 3:15 to 4:30pm.

The children will learn fine woodworking skills using hand tools, such as saws, chisels, planes, drills, rasps and hammers. They will engage in age-appropriate projects, developing their hand skills, fine and gross motor skills and hand-eye coordination.

The number of places is limited to 8. The cost of attending the club this term is £120. The cost includes tools and materials.

## **Messages from the Community**

### **Bushcraft and Nature Connection Day**

On Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> June we are running a family bushcraft and nature connecting day at Abington Woods, Little Abington.

Families with children of all ages are welcome!

This one-day practical bushcraft and nature connection workshop is aimed at families who would like to learn basic skills to enjoy the outdoors. In this workshop you will learn to:

- set up a simple shelter for cooking over an open fire
- chop wood and prepare kindling using axe and hatchet
- light fire using different fire lighting techniques
- cook outdoors over a fire
- use simple wood carving techniques with a knife with emphasis on safety with children
- play nature connection games with children

You will also experience family-orientated practical nature connection activities in a woodland setting. The day will include a talk about nature connection and its importance for the physical

development and mental wellbeing of children and adults with time for discussion and questions. The workshop includes a list of resources to take away.

The workshop will start at 09:00 and will finish at 16:00. Cost per family £65. Concessions available.

Spaces are limited to six families. Booking is essential.
